AGREED RESPONSE: In addition to any previous responses made in objection to application P/OUT/2023/02643 members wished to add their unanimous support for a recent application to extend the current school site, making the offer of land for a new school in relation to application P/OUT/2023/02643 rendered unnecessary. Further to this there has been a reduction in the housing supply that planning authorities need to demonstrate in the NPPF from 5 to 4 years, which further supports the Town Councils objection to the application.

P Hancock advised that the consultation result was 84% or responses received were in favour of the TC contributing financially towards funds being raised by The Dorset Museum & Art Gallery to purchase The Hoard from The British Museum in London. He advised that the remaining figure required stood at £622.25.

<u>RESOLVED</u>: Unanimously agreed that that the Town Council contributes a figure of £622.25 towards funds being raised by The Dorset Museum & Art Gallery to secure the purchase The

Hoard from The British Museum in London. (Local Government Act 1972, s.144 Power to contribute to organisations encouraging tourism. Small projects budget line)
